Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

Turning Your Phone ON

To turn your phone on, press for approximately two seconds.

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for Service" indicating that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters Standby mode — the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In power save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for Sprint PCS service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

Turning Your Phone OFF

Press **ENDIO** for two seconds.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off.

Getting Started With Sprint PCS Service

Determine If Your Phone Is Already Activated

If you received your phone in the mail or purchased it at a Sprint[®] Store, it probably has been activated. All you need to do is unlock your phone.

If your phone is not activated, please refer to your **Start Here Brochure** for easy step-by-step instructions.

Unlocking Your Phone

Follow these steps to unlock your phone:

- **1.** Press and hold \mathbf{E}_{ND} to turn the phone on.
- 2. Press 🥖.
- **3.** Enter your four-digit lock code. For security purposes, the code is not visible as you type.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of either your Social Security number or Sprint PCS Phone Number, or try 0000. If none of these work, call Sprint PCS Customer Care at 1-888-211-4PCS (4727).

Activating Your Phone

To activate your phone, follow the directions in the **Start Here Brochure** that was included with your phone. Or visit http://activate.sprintpcs.com and activate your phone online.

Setting Up Your Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your Sprint PCS Phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your Sprint PCS voicemail box and personal greeting as soon as your Sprint PCS Phone is activated.

To set up voicemail:

- 1. Press and hold 🚷.
- 2. Follow the system prompts to create your pass code, record your greeting, record your name announcement and choose whether to activate One-Touch Message Access (a feature that lets you press one key to access messages and bypasses the need for you to enter your pass code).

Note: The voicemail setup process may vary in certain affiliate areas.



Getting to Know Your Phone

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Command Keys



Menu: Displays the first level or Main Menu of options. Highlight and press *again* to view the next menu page.



OK: Pressing when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in the menu. Pressing for two seconds automatically dials your voicemail.



Internet Key: This key allows you to have One-Touch Internet access. When this key is pressed, the Sprint PCS Wireless Web browser is launched.



Navigation Key: This key allows you to scroll through the phone menu options, and provides a shortcut to phone functions from Standby Mode.



Volume Key: (On the side of your phone). Adjust the ringer volume in standby mode (with the flip open). Adjust the voice volume during a call. In a menu, scroll up or down to navigate through the menu options. Volume Keys also mute the ringer during an incoming call.



TALK: Place or receive a call. In standby mode, press the key once to enter the Outgoing call log. If you press and hold the key down you will initiate Voice Dial.



CLR (CLEAR): Deletes characters from the display. When in a menu, press to return to the previous menu.



END: Ends a call. Press and hold this key to turn your phone On or Off. While in the main menu, it returns the phone to standby mode and cancels your input.



Numeric Keys: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.



Pound: Enters the pound [#] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to enter a space.



Asterisk: Enters the asterisk [*] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type.



Headset Jack: (on the top of the phone.) Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe, convenient hands-free conversations.

Viewing the Display Screen

Main LCD:

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your main LCD screen.

- ► **T**ill shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
- $\Phi \not \oslash$ shows that the GPS receiver is On or Off.
- means your phone cannot find a signal.
 - tells you a call is in progress.
- indicates you are "roaming" off the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network.
- indicates you are "roaming" off the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network on an analog system.
- indicates you have voicemail, text, numeric pages, or Sprint PCS Web Alert messages waiting. Press briefly to see a list of pending messages or press and hold to dial voicemail.
- ▶ "₽" indicates your phone is in vibrate mode.
- shows your current battery charge strength. (Icon shown fully charged.)

External LCD:

- ► **T**ill shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
- means your phone cannot find a signal.
 - tells you a call is in progress.
- Time/Date is displayed.
- shows your current battery charge strength. (Icon shown fully discharged.) Icon is animated while charging.
- indicates you have voicemail, text, numeric pages, or Sprint PCS Web Alert messages waiting.

Tip: Display indicators let you know when you're off the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network and whether you're operating in digital or analog mode.

Getting to Know 2 Your Phone

Using the Battery

Battery Capacity

Your Sprint PCS Phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (LiIon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. The battery provides approximately **xx** hours of continuous digital talk time (**xx** hour in analog) or approximately **xx** hours of continuous digital standby time (**xx** hours in analog).

Approximately five minutes before the battery charge level gets too low to operate the phone, the battery sensor will let you know by blinking an empty battery icon ((___), sounding an audible alert and displaying a warning message. If you continue to operate the phone without charging, the phone will turn off automatically (after a three to five minute delay). If this happens, your call will end.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode and Browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to charge your phone's battery and watch your indicator to ensure your levels are okay.

Installing the Battery

Your Sprint PCS Phone comes with a LiIon battery. Follow these steps to install it:

- **1.** Place the battery on to the back of the phone, making sure that the three plastic tabs line up with the corresponding slots on the phone.
- **2.** Gently push the battery down and upward on the phone until it snaps into place.

Removing the Battery

To remove your battery for charging or for another reason, follow these easy steps:

- 1. Make sure the power is off by pressing and holding so you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- 2. Push down the battery release latch and slide the battery downwards.
- **3.** Lift the battery away from the phone.

Getting to Know Your Phone

Charging the Battery

Your Sprint PCS Phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge gets too low, the battery icon () blinks and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use a Sprint PCS-approved Travel Charger or Vehicle Power Adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

Using the Travel Adapter

To use the travel charger provided with your phone:

- 1. Plug the travel charger power cord into a wall outlet.
- **2.** Plug the other end of the travel charger into the bottom of the phone, with the battery installed.

The LED on the phone indicates the following:

- A red light with battery animation indicates the battery is charging.
- A green light without animation indicates the battery is fully charged.
- ► A yellow light indicates that the battery is operating at a temperature that is too high or too low, or that there is a poor connection. Make sure the phone is resting in the charger slot.

It generally takes about four hours to fully recharge a completely discharged battery. With the Sprint PCS-approved LiIon battery, it is practical to recharge the battery before it becomes completely discharged.

To get the quickest charge for any battery:

Turn the phone off.

Accessory Interface Connector

The accessory interface connector at the bottom of the phone allows you to connect the Travel Charger or Vehicle Power Adapter to the phone. It also allows you to connect the optional USB Data cable to the phone. For more information, see "Accessory Options" on page 130.

R oaming is the ability to make or receive calls while you're off the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network. Your new dual-band Sprint PCS® Phone works anywhere on the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network and allows you to roam on analog and digital networks virtually anywhere in the U.S. where compatible wireless service is available.

This section explains how roaming works as well as special features that let you manage your roaming experience.

Understanding Roaming

Understanding How Roaming Works

Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the Sprint PCS Network and whether your phone is operating in analog or digital mode. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

	Roaming Indicator	Analog Indicator
Sprint PCS Nationwide Network		
Other Digital Networks

Tip: Remember, when you're using your phone off the Sprint PCS Network, always dial numbers using 11 digits (1 + area code + number.)

Note: You will pay a higher per-minute rate for roaming calls.

Roaming on Other Digital Networks

When you're roaming on other digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls while on the Sprint PCS Network. You may not be able to access certain calling features, such as Sprint PCS Wireless Web.

Roaming on Analog Networks

When you roam on analog networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analog carriers today. Although some calling features, such as Sprint PCS Wireless Web, may be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls. You will experience a few differences including:

 You are more likely to experience static, cross-talk, fade-out and dropped calls.

Understanding Roaming

- Some calling features which are standard on the Sprint PCS Network, such as Call Waiting, Sprint PCS Wireless Web and direct international dialing, are unavailable.
- ► There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog services today.
- Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analog roaming.

Tip: If you're on a call when you leave the Sprint PCS Network and enter an area where roaming is available (whether digital or analog), your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think Sprint PCS Service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network.

Setting Your Phone's Roam Mode

Your Sprint PCS Phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you determine which signals your phone accepts.

Set Mode

Choose from three different settings on your dual-band mode phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Press 🖉 for Main Menu
- 2. Press 4_{GH} for Roaming.
- 3. Press for Set Mode. To select an option, scroll to select Automatic, Sprint PCS, or Analog.
- 4. Press & to Save.
- ► Automatic: This setting seeks Sprint PCS Service. When Sprint PCS Service is unavailable, it searches for an alternative system.
- Sprint PCS: This setting allows you to select the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network only and prevents roaming on other networks.
- ► Analog: This setting forces the phone to seek an analog roaming system. The previous setting is restored the next time the phone is turned on.

Setting an Alert When Roam Charges Apply (Call Guard)

In addition to the roaming icon, Call Guard alerts you when roaming charges apply. This feature makes it easy to manage your roaming charges by reminding you when you make or receive roaming calls. It also requires you to take additional steps before placing or answering a roaming call. These additional steps are not required when you make or receive calls while on the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network.

To Turn the Call Guard Feature On or Off:

- 1. Press 🖉 for the Main Menu.
- 2. Press 4_{GHI} for Roaming.
- **3.** Press **2**_{ABC} for **Call Guard**. Wait briefly until a message prompt displays and then disappears from the display screen.
- 4. Select Yes or No, and press 👔 .
- If the Yes option is chosen, an extra step is required to make or take roaming calls.
- If the No option is chosen, no extra step is required to make or take roaming calls.

To Place Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:

- From the main menu, dial the ten-digit number. (You can also initiate a call from the Internal Phone Book, Call History or (Sprint PCS Web Messages) and press and .
- A message is displayed indicating that roaming rate applies. Pressto place the call.

To Answer Incoming Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:

Remember if the Call Guard feature is set to **On**, you need to take extra steps to make and receive roaming calls even if you have selected the **Analog** setting.

Setting the Time and Date in Analog mode

The time and date are set automatically by the Sprint PCS Network. If you are outside your coverage area and are in analog mode, the time and date are not automatically updated. To set the time and date in analog mode:

- 1. Press 🔊 for the Main Menu.
- 2. Press 5.KL for Calendar.
- 3. Press Trons for Set Time.
- 4. Enter the correct time and date and press 👸 .

Making and Answering Calls

Making Calls

Your Sprint PCS[®] Phone offers many different ways to make calls, including Sprint PCS Voice CommandSM ("Using Sprint PCS Voice Command" on page 36), Speed Dialing ("Using One/Two/Three Speed Dialing" on page 43) and using Call History ("Viewing Call History (Incoming, Outgoing and Missed)" on page 62).

To make a call using your keypad:

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on.
- 2. Enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press and to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold and to erase the entire number.)
- **3.** Press **a**. (To make calls when you are roaming, and Call Guard is enabled, press **b** to acknowledge Roaming rates. For further information see "To Place Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:" on page 30)
- **4.** When you're finished, press e^{1000} or close the flip to complete the call.

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press we to view the phone number. Press we again to dial.

Tip: When making calls off the Sprint PCS Network, always dial using 11 digits (1 + area code + phone number).

Answering Calls

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on. If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.
- 2. When your phone rings, press 💽 . (To answer incoming calls when you are roaming and Call Guard is enabled press 🛄 . For further information see "To Answer Incoming Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:" on page 30)
- **3.** To disconnect the call, press *evon* briefly.

Adjusting Volume During a Conversation

Whether you need to hear more or less of a conversation, adjust the volume keys on the side of your phone during a call.

To preset the voice volume when the phone is in standby mode:

- 1. Press 🍠
- 2. Press Bruy for Sounds.
- 3. Press for Voice Volume.
- **4.** Select the desired level using the volume keys and press **(**) to save and exit.

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, the number of missed calls together with the last call's phone number is displayed on your screen.

To display the Missed Call log and view the last 10 missed calls:

- 1. Press 🥈
- 2. Press for Call History.
- 3. Press for Missed.

Note: To view the details of the missed call, highlight the entry and press **Q** .

To dial a missed call entry's phone number:

Highlight the entry. Press and .

Muting a Call

There are times when it's necessary to mute a call so that your caller does not hear you or certain background noise.

To use this function during a call:

- 1. Press 🏅
- 2. Press to Mute.
- ▶ When the phone is muted, "Mute" appears on the display.

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To unmute a call:

- 1. Press 🔊
- 2. Press to UnMute.

Using Sprint PCS Voice Command

With Sprint PCS, the first wireless provider to offer innovative Voice Command technology, reaching your friends, family, co-workers and teammates has never been easier — especially when you're on the go.

With Sprint PCS Voice Command:

- You can store all your contact's phone numbers, so you can simply say the name of the person you want to call.
- ► There's no need to punch in a lot of numbers, memorize voicemail passwords or try to dial while you're driving.
- You can call anyone in your Voice Command address book even if you don't remember their phone number.

It's Easy To Start

Just dial the from your Sprint PCS[®] Phone to activate the service. You can also dial the from your brough a Sprint PCS Voice Command tutorial directly from your phone.

Create Your Own Address Book

You can program up to 250 names into your address book and with the advanced technology of Sprint PCS Voice Command - you can have instant access to all of them.

There are four ways to update your address book:

- On the Web: Go to www.talk.sprintpcs.com and receive a fully functional Web-based address book to create and update your contacts.
- Use an Existing Address Book: Upload your contacts from Microsoft[®] Outlook,[®] Microsoft Excel and other personal information software into your address book for no additional charge.
- Call Directory Assistance: If you don't have a computer or Internet access handy, you can have Sprint PCS Directory Assistance look up phone numbers for you and automatically add them to your address book. Just say, "Call operator," and we'll add two names and

numbers to your address book for our standard directory assistance charge.

► Use Voice Recordings: Simply dial wave and say, "Add name." You will then be asked to say the name and number you want to add to your personal address book. Your address book can store up to 20 Voice Recordings at once.

How It Works

- Once you've signed up for Sprint PCS Voice Command and created your address book, all you do is press to a voil hear a tone followed by the prompt "Ready."
- **2.** After the "Ready" prompt, simply say, in a natural voice, the name of the person or the number you'd like to call. For example, you can say, "Call Jane at work," "Call John on his wireless phone," "Call 555-1234" or "Look up Bob."
- **3.** The number will automatically be dialed. Keep in mind that Sprint PCS Voice Command recognizes not only your voice, but any voice, so others can experience the same convenience if they use your phone.

Dialing Options

Dialing options are displayed when you enter numbers using the keypad.

To select an option press *a* and the number on the keypad that corresponds with the desired choice.

- (1) Talk is used to dial the phone number. (If you are roaming and have the Call Guard feature activated, you must then press
 See "To Place Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:" on page 30.)
- (2) Save to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. (See "Finding Internal Phone Book Entries" on page 74.)
- ► (3) Find is used to locate and display Internal Phone Book entries that contain the numbers entered. (See "Finding Internal Phone Book Entries" on page 74.)
- ▶ (4) Hard Pause is used to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 42.)

(5) 2 Second Pause to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 42.)

Tip: To speed dial a phone number from the main menu, press and hold the Internal Phone Book entry number. If the entry number is two digits, enter the first digit, then press and hold the second digit.

In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options in addition to the main menu.

To select an option, highlight it and press 🚷 .

- (1) Mute or UnMute Select Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone.
- ▶ (2) Call History checks your call log for outgoing, incoming, and missed calls. You can also erase the logs from this menu.
- (3) **PhoneBook** accesses the Phone Book menu options.
- (4) 3-Way Call allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. (For more information, see "Three-Way Calling" on page 59.)
- ► (5) Messages allows you to check for voicemail, page, and text messages.
- ► (6) Calendar accesses the Calendar menu options which allows you to schedule different events.
- **(7) Version** displays the hardware and software version being used.

Incoming Call Notification

Depending on your settings, your Sprint PCS Phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- ▶ The phone rings and/or vibrates.
- ▶ The LED flashes.
- The backlight illuminates on the main LCD screen when the flip is open. The backlight illuminates the external LCD when the flip is closed.
- ▶ The main/external screen displays an incoming call message.
- ▶ If the phone number is available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.

▶ If the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry's name is displayed.

The following option is also displayed.

• End: Silent to mute the ringer.

Note: You can also mute the ringer by pressing the up or down volume key.

Changing Ringer Volume

To change the ringer volume, adjust the volume keys on the side of your phone when the phone is in Standby mode and the flip is open.

Note: To change the ringer volume from the main menu, see "Changing Ringer Volume" on page 56.

End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Internal Phone Book, the phone number, the duration of the call and the following menu options are displayed for 10 seconds. During this time you can press to add this number to your internal phone book.

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number

Your Sprint PCS Phone can store up to 250 Internal Phone Book numbers. Phone Book entries can store up to a total of six phone numbers and the entry's name can contain 12 characters. There are seven different labels that are available, they are Home, Work, Mobile, Pager, Fax, or No Label. Any of these labels can be selected to be use as the Speed Dial number. Speed dial can only be assigned to one number in each phone book entry.

To save a number from the main menu:

- 1. Enter a phone number.
- 2. Press 🔊.

- 3. Press 2ABC for Save.
- 4. Press for New Entry?.
- Select the desired label by scrolling through the Home, Work, Mobile, Pager, Fax, or No Label. Press .
- **6.** Enter the name of the entry using the keypad. Press **and select** the desired entry mode. For more information on the different entry modes, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 51.
- 7. Press 🐒 to exit the Enter Name screen.
- 8. Press the Navigation key down and highlight the Entry field.
- **9.** Press the Navigation key to the left or right to display the desired entry, or leave the value defaulted to the first available.
- 10. Press the Navigation key down to highlight the Speed Dial field.

Note: The label selected in step 5 will already have the number being entered.

- **11.** Press the Navigation key left or right to scroll through all labels assigned to this entry. Choose the one you wish to be the primary number for this phone book entry.
- 12. Press the Navigation key down to highlight the Secret field.
- **13.** Press the Navigation key left or right to scroll between On or Off.
- Press the Navigation key down to highlight the Home, Work, Mobile, Pager, Fax, No Label and E-mail fields.
- 15. Press the Navigation key down and highlight the Group field.
- Press the Navigation key left or right to scroll between No Group, Friend, Family, Colleague, and VIP.
- 17. Press the Navigation key down and highlight the Name Ringer field.
- **18.** Press the Navigation key left or right to scroll through the different ringers.
- **19.** Press **8** to save the entry in the internal phone book.

Note: A phone number labeled Fax or Data can only be dialed through a personal computer.

Finding a Phone Number

You can search for Internal Phone Book entries with phone numbers that contain a specific string of numbers.

To find a phone number:

- **1.** Enter one or more digits. The more numbers you enter, the more specific the search becomes.
- **2.** Press *i* to display the main menu options.
- **3.** Press for **Find**. The phone prompts you to "Wait" and tells you how many numbers match the number of digits you just entered into the phone.
- **4.** Press the navigation key () up or down to scroll through the list of available matches.
- **5.** When the desired number is displayed, press $\mathbb{Z}_{\mathbb{Z}}$.

Four-Digit Dialing

Your phone has the ability to find and dial 4-digits of any phone number stored in the address book.

To call someone stored in your phone book by entering four digits of their phone number:

- **1.** From the standby mode, enter four digits of any phone number stored in the phone book.
- 2. Press TALK .

Note: If more than one number is found with the same last four digits, use the navigation key to scroll up or down to the desired entry. When the desired number is displayed, press

Or:

To dial four digits without the 4-digit dial feature interfering:

- **1.** From the standby mode, enter four digits.
- 2. Press 🔊 🚺 for 4-Digit Dial.

Making and Answering Calls

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a hard pause, the next set of numbers are sent when you press and . If you select a 2-second pause, your phone automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save a phone number with pauses:

- **1.** When in standby mode, enter the first digits of the phone number that comes before the required pause.
- 2. Press 🔊 to open the Menu options.
- **3.** Press for Hard Pause or **5** or **a** 2sec Pause. (Hard Pauses are displayed as a "P" and 2sec Pauses as a "T".)
- 4. Enter the additional numbers.

Note: Complete step three and four again, if necessary.

5. Press **TALK** to dial.

When dialing a number with a hard pause, highlight **Talk:DTMF** and press to send the next set of numbers.

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial **grows 1 1** and press **2 (**), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

Using One/Two/Three Speed Dialing

With this feature, you can automatically call Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 1-9, two key presses for locations 10-99, or three key presses for locations 100-250.

To use **One-Touch Dialing** for Speed Dial locations 1-9:

Press and hold the appropriate key for two seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting."

To use **Two-Touch Dialing** for Speed Dial locations 10-99:

- **1.** Press the first digit.
- **2.** Press and hold the second digit for two seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting."

To use **Three-Touch Dialing** for Speed Dial locations 100-250:

- **1.** Press the first digit.
- 2. Press the second digit.
- **3.** Press and hold the third digit for two seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting".

Displaying Your Phone Number

Just in case you forget your phone number, your Sprint PCS Phone can remind you.

To display your phone number:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Phonebook**.
- **3.** Press **30**^{EE} for My Phone #. Your phone number is displayed on the screen.

Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the **abc** mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 51). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

Characters scroll in the following order:



Note: If you press and hold a numeric key for two seconds, the corresponding number automatically is displayed. All alpha characters associated with the key are bypassed.

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

To enter characters using T9 Text Input, select the **T9 Word** mode (For more information, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 51).

T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press **Oner** to scroll through additional word selections. To accept a word and insert a space, press **Green**.

If you make a mistake, press **CLB** to erase a single character. Press and hold **CLB** to delete an entire entry.

Entering Symbols and Numbers

To enter symbols, select the **Symbol** mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 51). To enter a symbol, press the appropriate key indicated on the display.

To enter numbers, select the **Number** mode and press the appropriate key (For more information, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 51).

Making and Answering Calls

To change the ringer volume, use the volume keys on the side of your phone when the phone is in standby mode with the flip open.

To change the ringer volume from the Main Menu:

- 1. Press 🔊 for Menu options.
- 2. Press Bruy for Sounds.
- **3.** Press **for Ringer Volume**.
- 4. Press for Calls.
- 5. Select Off/Vibrate/1-Beep/Level 1-8/Ring+Vib, and press 🕵 .

Silencing the Ringer

To silence the ringer on incoming calls:

1. When the phone rings, press a volume key, or *form*. Press *are* to answer the call.

Adjusting Volume During a Conversation

When you need to regulate the volume during a conversation, use the volume keys on the side of your phone to adjust the sound.

Muting a Call

There are times when it's necessary to mute a call so that your caller does not hear you or certain background noise. To mute a call, press and hold

for two seconds. To unmute a call, press and hold for two seconds.

To **Mute** a call from the Main Menu:

- 1. Press 🔊 for Menu options, highlight UnMute.
- 2. Press either 😵 or 🚺 .
- When the phone is muted, "Mute" displays.

To UnMute a call:

- 1. Press 🔊 for Menu options.
- 2. Highlight UnMute, and press 🚷 or 🚺 .

N ow that you've mastered the basics, you can begin to focus on where you want to go. This section guides you step-by-step through the calling features that enhance your Sprint PCS Service. From Caller ID to Call Forwarding, using these features will help you make the most of your Sprint PCS Service.

Navigating and Tentering Text

Using Caller ID

Caller ID lets you know who's calling by displaying the number of the person calling when your phone rings. If the caller's name and number are already stored in your Internal Phone Book, the corresponding name appears with the number. In the same way, if you call someone who has this feature your phone number displays on their phone.

To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

- 1. Press *shift 6^{MNO} 7PORS .
- 2. Enter the number you want to call.
- **3.** Press $\mathbf{a}_{\mathbf{k}}$ (or highlight Roam Call and press $\mathbf{l}_{\mathbf{k}}$).

To permanently block your number, call Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Responding to Call Waiting

Call Waiting alerts you of incoming calls while you're on a call by sounding a beep. The display screen informs you that a call is coming in and shows the caller's phone number (if it's available and you are in digital coverage).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Press are . (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)
- ▶ To switch back to the first caller, press the again.

Tip: For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by pressing the temporarily disable Call Waiting is automatically reactivated once you end the call.

Note: You don't have to worry about being interrupted during a Sprint PCS Wireless Web[®] call because Call Waiting and Three-Way Calling are automatically disabled.

Entering Text

Three-Way Calling

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two different people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- **1.** During a conversation, press
- **2.** Enter the number for the third party, and press $\overline{\mathbf{x}}_{\mathbf{k}}$.
- 3. When you are connected to the third party, press once again to begin your Three-Way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call while on an existing call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Phone Book, Call History or Sprint PCS Wireless Web Messages. Highlight the desired number and press and . Once the party answers, press are again to connect all parties together.

Forwarding Your Calls

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number — even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone with Call Forwarding activated.

To Activate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Press * shift 7pars 2abc
- 2. Enter the area code and phone number to which your calls should be forwarded.
- **3.** Press A. You will hear a tone confirming the activation of Call Forwarding.

To Deactivate Call Forwarding:

- Press *shift 7pors 2ABC ONext .
- ▶ Press . You hear a tone to confirm the deactivation.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

T he Call History helps you manage your time more effectively. It keeps track of incoming calls, calls made from your Sprint PCS[®] Phone and missed calls. This section guides you through accessing and making the most of your Call History.

Viewing Call History (Incoming, Outgoing and Missed)

You'll find your Call History invaluable. It is a list of the last 10 phone numbers or Internal Phone Book entries for calls you placed, received or missed. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

Each entry contains the phone number (if it is available) and Internal Phone Book entry name (if the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book). Duplicate calls (same number and type of call) may only appear once on the list.

To view a Call History entry:

- 1. Press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- 3. Press for Outgoing, 2ABC for Incoming, and 3DEF for Missed.

Call History Options

For additional information and options on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press S followed by to view these options. This feature gives you the option of selecting:

- **Talk** to call the phone number.
- ► Save to save the sender's phone number (if the number is not already stored in your Internal Phone Book). For more information see "Saving a Phone Number From Call History" on page 64.
- Prepend to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number. (For more information see "Prepending a Phone Number From Call History" on page 63.)

Making a Call From Call History

To place a call from Call History:

1. Scroll to highlight the required number and press to complete the call.

Note: You cannot make calls from Call History to entries identified as No ID or Restricted. Calls labeled Data or Fax can only be dialed through a personal computer.

Prepending a Phone Number From Call History

If you need to make a call from Call History and you happen to be outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prefix by following these steps:

- 1. Press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- 3. Press for **Outgoing**, press **2**ABC for **Incoming**, or press **3**DEF for **Missed**.
- 4. When the call list displays, scroll to highlight the desired call log, and press
- 5. Press of for Menu options.
- 6. Press **3**^{DEF} to Prepend.
- **7.** Enter the appropriate digits to prepend, and press to be connected.

Saving a Phone Number From Call History

Your Sprint PCS Phone can store up to 250 Internal Phone Book numbers. Phone Book entries can store up to a total of 6 phone numbers and the entry's name can contain 12 characters.

To save a phone number from Call History:

- 1. Press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- **3.** Press for **Outgoing**, press **2**_{ABC} for **Incoming**, or press **3**_{DEF} for **Missed**.
- 4. Scroll to highlight the phone number and press 🚷
- **5.** Press for **A** Menu options.
- 6. Press 2_{ABC} to save.
- **7.** Follow the prompts to complete storing the number to your Internal Phone Book.

Note: You cannot save phone numbers already in your Internal Phone Book or from calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

Erasing Call History

To erase a Call History or all Call Histories:

- 1. From standby mode press \checkmark to open the Main Menu.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- **3.** Press for Erase History. This opens the **Erase History** menu. Scroll to highlight one of the options:

Outgoing, Incoming, Missed and All Calls.

4. Press **b** to erase the calls within the selected option and follow the prompts, or press **cur** to return to the previous menu.

Setting Up Voicemail

The first thing you'll want to do after activating your phone is set up your voicemail.

Knowing When You Have Messages

There are several ways your Sprint PCS Phone alerts you of new messages:

- ▶ By displaying a message on the screen.
- ▶ By displaying on the external LCD screen when the flip is closed.
- ▶ By playing the assigned ringer type.
- ▶ By the LED blinking red.
- ► By displaying _____ at the top of your screen for voicemail messages, Sprint PCS Web Messages, or Sprint PCS Web Alerts.

Message Types

There are three types of messaging features available from your Sprint PCS Phone's menu. You can receive voicemail, Sprint PCS Web Messages (also known as page/text or SMS messages) and Sprint PCS Web Alerts (also known as Browser messages) as long as your phone has enough memory to store them. If the memory is full, you will be prompted to delete old messages to make room.

- Voicemail automatically captures calls when you can't answer your phone or it is turned off. The voicemail system sends a notification to your phone when you have new voice messages or numeric pages.
- ▶ Web Messages include Sprint PCS Wireless Web Messages,* Sprint PCS Wireless Web Updates* and alerts that notify you of new Sprint PCS Wireless Web Mail^{SM*}. (For more information, see "Sending Web Messages" on page 68 or "Sprint PCS Wireless Web Update Options" on page 70.)
- ▶ Web Alerts let you know when you receive Sprint PCS Wireless Web Short MailSM* or an AOL Instant Message*. (For more information on each feature, see "The Sprint PCS Wireless Web" on page 106 or "Using AOL Instant Messenger Service" on page 115.)

* You may need to subscribe to the Sprint PCS Wireless Web to use these features, depending on your service plan.

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New Voicemail Message Alerts

When you receive a new voicemail message, your phone alerts you and displays \bigtriangledown .

Important: When you are roaming off the Sprint PCS Network, you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. It is recommended that you periodically check your voicemail by dialing 1 + area code + your Sprint PCS Phone Number. When your voicemail box answers, press and enter your pass code.

Note: Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, you are only notified of new messages when your phone is turned on and you are in a Sprint PCS Service area.

Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

You can review your messages directly from your Sprint PCS Phone or from any other touch-tone phone. To dial from your Sprint PCS Phone, you can either press and hold (a) for two seconds or use the menu keys.

Using One-Touch Message Access:

Press and hold a . Follow the system prompts.

Using the Menu Keys on Your Sprint PCS Phone to Access your Messages:

- **1.** From standby mode press **J** for **Main Menu**.
- 2. Press for Voice Mail.
- 3. Press **to Listen**.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your Sprint PCS Phone.

Using a Phone Other Than Your Sprint PCS Phone to Access Your Messages:

- 1. Dial your Sprint PCS Phone Number.
- 2. When your voicemail box answers, press \star_{shift} .
- **3.** Enter your pass code.

Clearing the Voicemail Message Icon

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the icon after you have checked your voicemail messages.

To clear the icon from the display screen:

- **1.** From standby mode press 🖉 for **Main Menu**.
- 2. Press for Voice Mail.
- 3. Press 2_{ABC} to Reset.

Sending Web Messages

Numeric Pages

Callers can send a numeric page to your phone when they reach your voicemail box. Numeric paging to a Sprint PCS Phone comes at no additional charge on any service plan that includes Sprint PCS Voicemail.

Note: The numeric paging option for your Sprint PCS Phone must be turned on for your phone to receive pages. This option can be set by entering your voicemail feature options.

Sprint PCS Wireless Web Messages

There are three ways to send a Sprint PCS Wireless Web Message to a Sprint PCS Phone:

- **E-mail** (yourphonenumber@messaging.sprintpcs.com).
- Through the Sprint PCS Web site www.sprintpcs.com. Select the wireless web messaging link.
- **Using a messaging software** (TAP 1.5 compatible).

Sprint PCS Wireless Web Updates

To have Sprint PCS Wireless Web Updates automatically sent to your phone, see "Signing up for Sprint PCS Wireless Web Updates" on page 118.

New Sprint PCS Wireless Web Messages

When you receive a new Web Message, your phone notifies you. Press **&** to **Read** the message.

Sprint PCS Wireless Web Message Storage

Your Sprint PCS Phone can store up to 94 Web Messages. Each time you receive a new message, the amount of memory is decreased. The full memory percentage is updated instantly and displayed on the screen.

Displaying Sprint PCS Web Messages

To display a Wireless Web Message from the message notification alert, see "New Sprint PCS Wireless Web Messages" on page 68.

To display a Web Message from the Main Menu:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 2ABC for Wireless Web.
- **3.** Press **2**ABC for **Messages**.

Numeric Page Options

After you display a numeric page, press *b* to display the numeric page message options. To select an option, scroll to highlight it and press **a**.

- **Talk** Calls the highlighted phone number.
- Save # Saves the sender's phone number if it is not already in your Internal Phone Book (if applicable).
- **Erase** Erases the current numeric page.
- **Next Msg** Moves forward to the next message.
- **Prev Msg** Returns to the previous message.
- Extract #s Extracts the phone numbers (if there are numbers contained in the text message.) (For further information see "Extracting Phone Numbers from a Web Message" on page 70.)

Extracting Phone Numbers from a Web Message

After you display a Sprint PCS Web message, press 🖉 to display message options.

To extract a phone number contained in the message:

- Highlight **Extract #s** and press **&**. All the phone numbers 1. contained in the message are displayed.
- Highlight the number you want to extract and press **§**. 2.



The following options are displayed:

- Call to dial the extracted phone number
- Save Phone to save the extracted phone number to the Internal Phone Book.

Erasing All Wireless Web Messages

To erase all Wireless Web messages:

- 4. Using the Navigation key, highlight **Yes** and press or press cu to exit.

Note: If the message icon continues to display in standby mode, a new or unread message exists in another category.

Finding Internal Phone Book Entries

There are several ways to display your Internal Phone Book entries. Follow the steps outlined in the sections below to display entries from the Internal Phone Book menu.

Finding Names

You can review all the entries stored in your Internal Phone Book or find an entry quickly by following these simple steps:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Phone Book**.
- **3.** Press **1** for **Find Name**. The list of names is displayed in alphabetical order. (The Speed Dial number displays next to the entry.)
- **4.** Enter the first letter of the person's name you want to find. Use the Navigation key to scroll through the list of possible matches. Additional letters may be entered to narrow the name matches.

Finding Entries

To find an Internal Phone Book entry by its entry number:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Phone Book**.
- **3.** Press for **Find Entry**. The list of names is displayed in numeric order of the Speed Dial number

Internal Phone Book Entry Options

When you display an Internal Phone Book entry, the following options are displayed. To select an option, highlight it and press **§**.

- **Talk** to call the current phone number.
- Add Phone# to add a phone number.
- **Edit** to edit the current entry.
- ▶ **Prepend** to add numbers at the beginning of an existing phone number.
- **Erase** to erase the current entry.

Adding a Phone Number to an Internal Phone Book Entry

To add a phone number to an entry:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Phone Book**.
- **3.** Press for **Find Name**. The list of names is displayed in alphabetical order. (The Speed Dial number displays next to the entry.)
- 4. When the desired name is found, highlight it and press 🐔
- 5. Press *and press* and press for Add Phone #.
- 6. Enter the new number using the keypad and press 🚳
- 7. Select the desired Label and press 🚷.
- 8. Press 🖁 to save the entry and return to standby mode.

Note: Phone numbers labeled Fax or Data can only be dialed through a personal computer.

Editing an Internal Phone Book Entry

To make changes to an entry:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🄊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 3^{DEF} for Phone Book.
- 3. Select either for Find Name, or 4m for Find Entry.
- 4. When the desired name is found, highlight it and press 👸.
- 5. Press 🖉 for **Menu** options.
- 6. Press for Edit.

To select an option, highlight it and press 👸.

- Entry is the memory location of the phone book entry. There are 250 memory locations available.
- Speed Dial allows you to choose which number saved in a particular entry will be the Speed Dial number. Only one number per entry can be set to Speed Dial.
- Secret hides the phone number and user information from displaying on the screen. Instead, Secret is displayed.

Note: These numbers can still be dialed, but the name & number will be hidden.

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- **Home** is used as a label when you save a home number.
- **Work** is used as a label when you save a work number.
- **Mobile** is used as a label when you save a mobile number.
- **Pager** is used as a label when you save a pager number.
- **Fax** is used as a label when you save a fax number.
- ▶ **No Label** is used when you save a number that does not conform to one of the other labels.
- **E-mail** is used to save an email address in the intenal phone book.
- ▶ **Group** is used to save the phone book entry into a group. The default groups are: No Group, Friend, Family, Colleague, or VIP.
- ▶ **Name Ringer** is used to designate a specific ringer sound when you receive a call from the number saved in the phone book.

Note: "Default" means the global ringer selected for all incoming calls will be played.

Adding an E-mail Address to an Internal Phone Book Entry

To add an email address to an entry:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Phone Book**.
- **3.** Press for Add email.
- 4. Enter the new email address using the keypad and press 🚳
- 5. Save as a New Entry or highlight an existing entry and press 🚷.
- **6.** Press **&** to save the entry and return to standby mode.

Dialing Sprint PCS Services

You must be in digital mode to access Sprint PCS Services.

To dial a service:

- **1.** From standby mode, press *f* for **Main Menu**.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Phone Book**.
- 3. Press Teams for Services.
- 4. Highlight Account Info, Customer Care, Dir Assist, or Prepaid SVC and press **S**.
- 5. Press TALK .

My Sprint PCS Phone Number

To display your phone number:

- From standby mode, press for Main Menu.
 Press for Phone Book.
- **3.** Press **30**^{EF} for **My Phone#**.

Navigating and **11** Entering Text

Changing the Greeting

The greeting can be up to 16 characters and is displayed on the first line of your phone's display screen in standby mode.

To change your greeting:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **9**^{WXYZ} for **Setup/Tool**.
- 3. Press for Display.
- 4. Press **3DEF** for **Greeting**.
- 5. Press and for at least two seconds to erase the existing greeting.
- 6. Press at to display the text entry modes. Highlight the desired mode and press & to select.
- **7.** Type in the new greeting and press **§**.

Setting the Language of your Phone

Your phone can display all menus and messages in either Spanish or English; all verbal prompts will also be spoken by the phone in the selected language. It's quick, easy and very convenient for bilingual families or friends. To change the language of your phone:

- 1. From the Main Menu press over for Setup/Tool.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for Language.
- 3. Scroll to highlight English or Spanish.
- 4. When the desired option displays, press $\{$

Adjusting the Ringer Volume

To adjust the ringer volume:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press BTUY for Sounds.
- 3. Press for Ringer Volume. The following options display: Calls, Messages and Alarms.
- **4.** Select the desired option and press $\{$
- 5. Scroll to the desired **Ringer Volume**, and press 🚷 .

Tip: You can use the volume control keys located on the side of the phone to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode with the flip open or the voice volume during a call.

Ringer Types

Ringer types help you identify incoming calls and messages. You can assign Ringer Types to individual Internal Phone Book entries, calls and messages.

- Preprogrammed Ringers include a variety of standard ringer types and familiar music.
- Vibrating Ringer alerts you to calls or messages without disturbing others.
- Downloaded Ringers allows you to download custom ringers from the wireless web.

Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls

To select a ringer type for voice calls:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🎤 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press BTUY for Sounds.
- 3. Press **2ABC** for **Ringer Type**.
- 4. Press for Voice Calls.
- 5. Select either with Caller ID or no Caller ID, and press
- 6. Listen to the available **Ringer Types** and press **&** to select.

Tip: If your ringer is set to vibrate or Off, you can review the ringer types but will not hear them.

Sprint PCS Ringers & MoreSM

With Sprint PCS Ringers & More, you can express your personality with an array of downloadable ringers and graphics. Sprint PCS Ringers & More is an optional service you can add to your monthly service plan rate.

Downloading Ringers and Graphics

To download an available ringer or graphic to your phone:

- 1. From the main menu, highlight Wireless Web and press 🚷 .
- 2. Highlight Downloads and press 🚷
- **3.** Highlight Get New and press **3.** The Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser will launch.

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Navigating and Entering Text **Note:** You are charged for airtime minutes when using the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser.

- **4.** Using your navigation key to scroll up or down, select Graphics or Ringers, highlight the OK softkey and press . (For more information on navigating the Sprint PCS Wireless Web, see "Using the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser" on page 109.)
- **5.** Select an item to download, highlight the OK softkey and press **§**. The selected ringer or graphic will automatically be downloaded to your phone.
- 6. Press an to return to the Downloads menu or and to return to the main menu.

Note: You may store up to five downloaded ringers and five downloaded graphics in addition to those originally programmed into your phone. If you download more than five ringers or graphics, a message is displayed that says "No Additional Memory Available".

Assigning Downloaded Ringers and Graphics

Downloaded ringers and graphics may be assigned directly from the Downloads menu and are also available through the Settings menu.

To assign a downloaded ringer or graphic through the Settings menu, see "Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls" on page 81, "Selecting Ringer Types for Messages" on page 83, or "Changing the Greeting" on page 80.

To assign a downloaded ringer or graphic from the Downloads menu:

- 1. Press 🔊.
- 2. Press 2ABC for Wireless Web.
- **3.** Press **1** for **Downloads**.
- 4. Press 2ABC for Ringers or 3DEF for Idle Screens.
- **5.** Follow the screen prompts to continue.

For Ringers:

- ▶ Voice Calls with Caller ID to assign a ringer for incoming calls with Caller ID.
- **Calls With No Caller ID** for incoming calls without Caller ID.

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- Messages Voicemail for incoming voicemail messages.
- Messages Page for incoming page messages.
- Messages Text for incoming text messages.
- Messages Web Alerts for incoming web alert messages.
- ▶ Alarms this setting allows you to select different ringers for alarms.
- **Data/Fax In** for incoming Data/Fax calls.

For Graphics:

 Idle Screen to assign a graphic to display while the phone is in Idle mode.

Selecting Ringer Types for Messages

To select a ringer type for messages:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press BTUV for Sounds.
- 3. Press 2ABC for Ringer Type.
- 4. Press 2ABC for Messages.
- 5. Select Voice Mail, Page, Text, or Web Alerts and press 🔒 .
- **6.** Listen to the available **Ringer Types**, and press **(3)** to select. For information on downloadable ringers, see "Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls" on page 81).

Navigating and **11** Entering Text

Selecting Ringer Types for Alarms

To select a ringer type for alarms:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press BTUY for Sounds.
- 3. Press 2ABC for Ringer Type.
- 4. Press **3DEF** for **Alarms**.
- 5. Listen to the available **Ringer Types**, and press **&** to select.

Selecting Ringer Types for Data / Fax In

To select a ringer type for data/fax in:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press BTUY for Sounds.
- 3. Press 2ABC for Ringer Type.
- **4.** Press **4** for **Data/Fax In**.
- 5. Listen to the available **Ringer Types**, and press 🚷 to select.

Changing the Backlight Time Length

The backlight setting lets you select how long the display screen and keypad are backlit after any key press is made.

To change the backlight setting:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press gwxyz for Setup/Tool.
- **3.** Press for **Display**.
- 4. Press 2ABC for Backlight.
- **5.** Select from the following options:
- ▶ Flip Open
- 30 Seconds
- 8 Seconds
- ▶ Off
- 6. Press 🗞 to save and exit.

Note: Long backlight settings affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Connect Alert

Your phone has the ability of sounding a ring tone alert whenever a call is connected. To setup this option:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 8_{TUV} for Sounds.
- 3. Press **5**JKL for **Alerts**.
- 4. Press 3DEF for Connect.
- 5. Highlight On or Off using the navigation key. Press 🚷 to save.

Disconnect Alert

Your phone has the ability to sound a disconnect alert tone when the other caller completes the call and hangs up. To setup this option:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press Bruy for Sounds.
- 3. Press **5**JKL for **Alerts**.
- 4. Press of Disconnect.
- 5. Highlight On or Off using the navigation key. Press 🚷 to save.



Changing the Contrast

To adjust the contrast on the phone's display:

- **1.** From standby mode, press S for **Main Menu**.
- 2. Press gwxyz for Setup/Tool.
- **3.** Press for **Display**.
- 4. Press **4**_{GHI} for **Contrast**.
- 5. Select a setting from Lowest, Low, MED, High, or Highest and press (to select.

Data/Fax Mode

The Sprint PCS Wireless WebTM Connection Kit (purchased separately) lets you link your laptop PC to your phone so you can send and receive data and faxes.

Tip: The phone must be on a digital network to send or receive data and faxes.

Receiving a Fax

To receive a fax with your phone:

- **1.** Make sure that your phone is connected to your computing device and is powered "On."
- 2. From standby mode, press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 3. Press 2ABC for Wireless Web.
- 4. Press 5JKL for Connection.
- Using the Navigation key, select Data/Fax In Incoming Fax only and press to select. (Notice that the phone displays "No incoming voice calls can be received". Your phone returns to standby mode and displays *Fax Only*.)

Receiving Data

To receive data with your phone:

- **1.** Make sure that your phone is connected to your computing device and is powered "On."
- 2. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 3. Press **2**ABC for **Wireless Web**.
- 4. Press **5**JKL for **Connection**.
- Select Data/Fax In Incoming Data only and press . (Notice that the phone displays "No incoming voice calls can be received". Your phone returns to standby mode and displays *Data Only*.)

Returning to Voice Mode

To return to standby mode from Data/Fax mode:

- **1.** Make sure that your phone is connected to your computing device and is powered "On."
- 2. From standby mode, press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 3. Press **2**ABC for **Wireless Web**.
- 4. Press **5**JKL for **Connection**.
- Select Data/Fax Off: Voice Only and press . (Notice that the phone displays "No incoming data/fax calls can be received". Your phone returns to standby mode.)

Note: The phone always powers up in standby mode, even if it was powered down in Data/Fax mode. The phone also returns to standby mode if the data cable is disconnected.

B y using the security setting on your Sprint PCS $^{\circledast}$ Phone, you receive peace of mind without sacrificing flexibility. With several options available, you can customize your phone to meet your personal needs.

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Accessing the Security Menu

You must enter your lock code to view the Security menu. If you forget your lock code, try using the last four digits of your Social Security number, the last four digits of your phone Number, or "0000".

To access the Security menu:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press gwvz for Setup/Tools.
- 3. Press 2ABC for Security.
- 4. Enter your lock code, and the **Security** menu displays.

Locking Your Phone

When your phone is locked, you can only receive incoming calls or make calls to 911, Sprint PCS Customer Care or special numbers.

To lock your phone:

- 1. Access the Security menu.
- 2. Press for Lock Phone. The available options are:
- Unlocked
- On Power Up
- Lock Now
- 3. Select Lock Now and press 🚷 .

Unlocking Your Phone

To unlock your phone:

- 1. Press 🔒 .
- 2. Enter your lock code.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of either your Social Security number or Sprint PCS Phone Number or try 0000. If none of these work, call Sprint PCS Customer Care at 1-888-211-4PCS (4727).

Changing the Lock Code

To change your lock code:

- 1. Access the Security menu.
- 2. Press 2ABC for Change Lock. Your Lock Code number displays.
- **3.** Enter a new **Lock Code** number (this will override your original lock code number), and press **4**.

Calling in Lock Mode

You can place calls to 911 and to your special numbers when in lock mode.

To place an outgoing call in lock mode:

- ► To call an emergency number, special number, or Sprint PCS Customer Service, enter the phone number and press
- ► To place normal outgoing calls. Press to display the lock code screen, enter the lock code. Enter the phone number, and press to complete the call.

Using Special Numbers

You can hide up to three phone numbers that require your lock code to make them "special."

All three special numbers can be manually dialed at any time, even when your phone is locked.

To make a number special:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press gwxyz for Setup/Tool.
- 3. Press 2ABC for Security.
- 4. Enter the phone's lock code, the **Security** menu displays.
- 5. Press 3^{DEF} for Special #.
- **6.** Select an available space and press **(3)**, or just enter the space's number. Enter the phone number, and press **(3)**.

Erasing Special Numbers

To erase a special number:

- 1. Access the **Security** menu.
- 2. Press **3DEF** for **Special #**.
- **3.** Select the number that you wish to erase, and press $\{x_i\}$.
- 4. Press 🚥 to erase the number, and press 🚷 .

Erasing the Internal Phone Book

You can erase all the numbers stored in your Internal Phone Book. This is useful if you want to loan, or give your phone to a friend or family member.

To erase your Internal Phone Book:

- 1. Access the Security menu.
- 2. Press 4 for Erase PBook.
- 3. Using the Navigation key, select Yes.

If you do not wish to erase your Internal Phone Book, select **No** and press to return to the previous menu.

Resetting Your Phone

Resetting your phone returns all setup options to the factory's default settings. All of your important personal data (Internal Phone Book, Voice Recordings), are unaffected by resetting your phone.

To reset your phone:

- 1. Access the Security menu.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for **Reset Phone**.
- 3. Select Yes and press 🖏 .
- **4.** Select **Yes** again and press **§** to confirm and reset the phone to the factory defaults.

The phone reboots (turns itself off and back On), restores the default settings, such as ringers, erases your messages and then returns to standby mode.

Y our Sprint PCS[®] Phone has been equipped with several personal information management features to help you manage your busy lifestyle. These features turn your phone into a time management planner that helps you keep up with your contacts, schedules and commitments. It takes productivity to a whole new level.

Accessing the Scheduler

Your scheduler helps organize your time and reminds you of important events.

How To Access Your Scheduler

- **1.** From standby mode, press \mathcal{J} for **Main Menu**.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for **Calendar**.
- **3.** Scroll to highlight an option. The available options are:
- Today
- Month View
- Jump To Date
- Task List
- Countdown
- Alarm Clock
- Set Time
- **4.** Press **&** to open the selected option.

Calendar

Calendar functions allow you to schedule personal events and view them in an easily read calendar format. These functions are also available to you when you are talking on your phone.

Today

Allows you to schedule events for today, that will automatically appear on your "Today" events schedule for that day. You can schedule up to nine events for the current day with each event's start and end time. You can even have your phone alert you before an event starts.

Month View

Month View allows you to view a calendar of the current month, a past month, or a future month. In Month View, the current date is highlighted on the calendar. Days with scheduled events are *<u>underlined</u>*. When in Month View, the navigation keys work like this:

- Moving the scroll left or right allows the calendar to be moved backward or forward a day.
- Moving the scroll up or down moves the calendar by one week.

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 Pressing the volume keys up or down allows the calendar to move month to month.

Jump To Date

Jump To Date allows you to specify the calendar date you want to view. Arriving at the desired date, you can enter, edit, and/or erase events in your calendar.

Task List

Allows you to compile a list of items to be completed. Your phone can store and manage 20 "Task List" items.

Countdown

Countdown allows you to find out how much time will elapse between the time entered and an event scheduled.

- Press the correct volume key to scroll between A.M. or P.M. or press 2ABC for A.M., or Zeons for P.M.
- Countdowns can be entered for dates between the years 1980 and 2099.

Alarm Clock

Your phone has an alarm clock with three separate alarms. Each alarm can be set once, or daily at a programmed time.

Set Time

Your phone keeps the time and date directly from the Sprint PCS system while inside the Sprint PCS Service Area. If you roam outside of the Sprint PCS Service Area, or turn on your phone in an analog roaming area, you'll need to set the time manually.

When you turn on your phone in Analog Mode you will be prompted to enter the current date and time. Press the appropriate keys to enter the correct date and time in a numeric mode. Time is represented as hh:mm A/P and the date is represented as 00/00/0000.

To Set Time using the menu options

- **1.** From standby mode, press *J* for **Main Menu**.
- 2. Press JKL for Calendar.
- 3. Press Teams for Set Time.

Tip: Use the numeric keys to enter the current time and date.

Adding New Events

- 1. From standby mode, press 🎤 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for **Calendar**.
- **3.** Press **t** for **Today**.
- **4.** Press for input mode options **T9 (English)**, **Alpha, Symbol**, and **Number**. Select an option and press to activate.
- **5.** Enter the event's title or name information. You can enter up to 32 characters. For more information on Text and Symbol Entry refer to "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 51. The default entry mode is T9 (English).
- 6. Press 🚯 to continue to the **Next Step**.
- 7. Enter the start time and move the scroll key down once to move to the date field. Enter the date, and press **§**.
- 8. Enter the end time and move the scroll key down once to move to the date field. Enter the date if different from what is shown, and press
- Scroll to select the alarm option of choice, and press . The options are: 10 minutes Before, On time, No Alarm, 1 hour Before, or 30 minutes Before.

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Personal Information Management

Tip: Use the volume control keys to scroll by month through the Calendar, or scroll up or down to view by week.

- 10. Press
- Notice the heading "Event" at the top of the display screen. This informs you of how many events you have scheduled for the day and the number of the event you are displaying.
- **11.** Press and hold **GIB** to return to the **Month View**.

Viewing an Event

The Event screen displays the number of events listed for the current day. Scroll through the other events. If no events are scheduled, you will be prompted to add a new event.

Editing an Event

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for **Calendar**.
- 3. Press **t** for **Today**.
- **4.** Select an existing event, and press \mathcal{J} .
- 5. Press and to edit that event, and continue to press until the information you want to edit displays. Enter the new information over the old, then press . (If you are editing an alarm, scroll to the "New" option.)
- 6. Press 🚷 until storing displays.
- 7. Press cup to return to the Calendar.

Erasing an Event

- 1. From standby mode, press 🄊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for **Calendar**.
- **3**. Press **t** for **Today**.
- **4.** Scroll to highlight an existing event, press and press are given, to erase. You are given the option to enter a new event. If you do not wish to enter a new event, press and hold **CLB** to return to the **Month View**.

Note: Default alarm times are 10 minutes for Meetings, Events and Dining Appointments, 24 hours for Special Occasions and zero minutes for Call Alarms.

Your phone has an Alarm Clock feature with three separate alarms. Each alarm can be set once, or daily at a programmed time of your choosing.

To set the Alarm Clock:

- 1. From standby mode, press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **5**JKL for **Calendar**.
- **3.** Press for Alarm Clock.
- 4. Scroll to highlight Alarm #1, #2, or #3, and press 🚯, or select the number next to desired alarm.
- 5. Select Daily, Once or Reset for the alarm, and press .
- 6. Enter the date and time for the alarm. Use the volume keys on the side of the phone to select AM. or P.M., or press **2ABC** for A.M., or **PORE** for P.M. Note that no date setting is available for a **Daily** alarm.
- 7. Press 👸 .

Erasing a Programmed Alarm

- **1.** Repeat steps 1 through 3 above.
- 2. Scroll to highlight the Alarm# you wish to set and press 🚳 . The following options display: Daily, Once or Reset.
- **3.** Use the navigation key to select **Reset.**

Using the Voice Services of Your Sprint PCS Phone

Using Voice-Activated Dialing

 $T \label{eq:topological} his section explains the features associated with your phone's Voice Services. The easy-to-follow instructions explain how to make calls or go to a menu by simply speaking a command. You'll also learn how to record memos and personal ringers.$



Using Voice-Activated Dialing

Your phone features voice-activated dialing. You can call up to 10 stored entries by speaking the individual's or company's name into the microphone. Using the voice-activated dialing option requires that you first program the phone to recognize the name of the individual or company you are calling.

Tips on recording names

- Avoid recording similar names phonetically. If you record a name similar to one that is already stored in a voice-dial memory, the phone requests another name.
- Avoid recording in a noisy place.
- Speak clearly and naturally.
- Avoid very long or very short names. Names with two to five syllables are recommended.
- ▶ If a voice dial entry does not properly connect, you may need to record the name and number again.

Note: Record Voice Dial tags in a quiet environment and without the aid of an accessory (for example, a headset or hands-free car kit).

Programming the Phone for Voice Dialing

Programming your phone for voice activated dialing is easy. The phone provides voice prompts and screen displays to guide you through the recording process. To program the phone for voice activated dialing:

- 1. From the Main Menu press **Toms** for Voice Dial.
- 2. Press for **Record**. The phone will prompt you to say the name you want to program.
- **3.** Wait for the beep and then say the name. For best results, use names with at least two syllables, or use both a first and last name. The phone stores the name as a "first" sample, and then prompts you to say the name again.
- **4.** Respond to the prompt by repeating the name after the beep exactly as you did the first time. The phone stores the name as a second sample and then requests the phone number.
- **5.** Enter the phone number on the keypad.

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- **6.** To store the phone number, press **6**. The number you entered displays, along with the notification 'Recorded'. If the number you entered matches a name/number already stored in your Internal Phone Book, then the name also displays.
- 7. The screen then returns to the **Voice Dial** menu.

Setting Up Voice Dial

Voice Dial is always active once you have programmed the phone with Voice Dial entries. To place voice activated calls, press and hold \bowtie . Then say the name into the phone after you hear the voice prompt and the beep.

You can also initiate a voice activated call by opening the flip, when this feature is activated.

To change the Voice Dial setup options:

- 1. From the Main Menu press for Voice Dial.
- 2. Press of for Set Active.
- **3.** Press the Navigation key up or down to scroll between the following options:
- ▶ TALK Only Enables voice dialing by pressing and holding 🔤 .
- ► **TALK / Flip** Enables voice dialing by pressing and holding we (when the phone is open), or by simply opening the phone's flip cover.
- 4. Select the desired option and press 🚳 .

Vavigating and **14** Entering Text

Placing a Call Using Voice Dial

To place a call if Voice Dial is inactive:

- 1. Open the phone.
- **2.** Press and hold down the wey.
- **3.** At the voice prompt, say the name into the phone.
- ▶ The phone automatically places the call if it recognizes the name.
- ► If the phone does not recognize the name, it says **Who would you like to call?** again and prompts **Locating Name**.
- If the phone is unable to recognize the name after two attempts, it says The name cannot be recognized and prompts Cannot recognize name. Please check name. The phone returns automatically to standby mode, and you can try the call again later.

Reviewing Voice Dial Entries

To review Voice Dial entries:

- 1. From the Main Menu press **Tools** for **Voice Dial**.
- **2.** Press **CARE** for **Review**. A list of your stored voice dial numbers display, (the names also display if stored in the Internal Phone Book).
- **3.** Press the associated key to select the desired entry, or scroll to the desired entry and press **3.** The recorded name plays audibly. You can scroll through entries without having to listen to each one, or you can listen to them all as they play in order.
- **4.** Press **CLB** to return to the previous screen.

Erasing Voice Dial Entries

To erase an individual Voice Dial entry:

- 1. From the Main Menu press for Voice Dial.
- 2. Press 2ABC for **Review**. A list of entries are displayed.
- **3.** Press the associated key to select the desired entry, or scroll to highlight the desired entry, and press **3**. The recorded name plays audibly and you are prompted with **"OK: Erase"**.
- 4. Press 👔 to Erase that entry.
- 5. Press the navigation key left or right to highlight "Yes" or "No".
- 6. Press 🔒 .

To erase all Voice Dial entries:

- 1. From the Main Menu press Terms for Voice Dial.
- 2. Press great for **Erase All**. You are given a confirmation screen and a confirmation voice prompt.
- **3.** Press to **Erase** all Voice Dial entries or **CP** to return to the previous screen.

The Sprint PCS Wireless Web

With the Sprint PCS Wireless Web and your wireless Internet-ready phone, you have access to many features via the wireless Internet:

- ► The Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser allows you to view specially-designed versions of popular web sites.
- Sprint PCS Wireless Web Mail lets you send and receive email quickly and easily.
- ► **The AOL Instant Messenger Service** lets you keep in touch with family and friends via two-way instant messaging.
- ▶ With Sprint PCS Wireless Web Short Mail, you can use a person's Sprint PCS Phone Number to send instant text messages to their Internet-ready Sprint PCS Phone – and they can send messages to you.
- Sprint PCS Wireless Web Updates let you receive daily information updates, including weather, stock quotes and sports scores.
- ► The Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection lets you connect to the Internet or your company's network with a laptop PC or handheld computing device and a Sprint PCS Wireless Web[™] Connection Kit.

Note: Sprint PCS Wireless Web service will not work when roaming off the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network and may not be available in select affiliate areas.

The Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser

Your phone comes equipped with a Browser, which allows you to access up-to-the minute information through the Sprint PCS Wireless Web.

You can view specially-designed versions of popular Internet sites, including Yahoo![®], Amazon.com[®], The Weather Channel[®] and more. Browsing the Sprint PCS Wireless Web using your phone is different than using a home computer because sites display specialized text and reduce their graphics.

The Browser connects to the Internet by placing a call. Note that appears on the display whenever a call is in progress, just as with a regular voice call. Service charges vary depending on your service option.

Launching the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser

To launch the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser:

- 1. Press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press 2ABC for Wireless Web.
- **3.** Press for **Start Browser**. Phone prompt states: "Charges will apply to Browser calls. Start Wireless Web?"

Or:

1. Press **(a)** to launch the MiniBrowser or from standby mode.

The first time you use the Browser, you'll be prompted to enable the security feature. This automatic process will take 3-6 minutes to complete and it occurs just once. When the process is complete, you're ready to start using the Sprint PCS Wireless Web.

Following the security setup, you'll see the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page. This is the main page for the Browser and it gives you access to all the sites in the Sprint PCS Wireless Web. The next time you use the Browser, you may not see the home page at first because the Browser will display the page you were viewing when you last exited the Browser.

The Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page

Note: The Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page is subject to change.

You may notice that sometimes the Browser will launch without placing a call. This is because the phone stores recently viewed pages in its memory cache. The Browser will connect automatically when you access a page that's not stored in the cache. This reduces the wireless web usage times.

If the phone has been inactive for a while and a new wireless Internet site has not been requested, the Browser will automatically disconnect. The Browser will remain active — only the connection will end. The Browser will automatically reconnect when you go to a wireless Internet site that's not stored in the phone's memory cache. For this reason, you may find that you are billed for several network connections within a single session. This is normal and is designed to minimize airtime charges.

When launching the Browser, you may need to take an extra step or see a reminder that Browser calls will be charged. (See "Web Guard" below for more information.)

Web Guard

The Web Guard requires you to take an extra step each time you launch or exit the Browser. To change the Web Guard setting:

- 1. Press 🔊 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **2**ABC for **Wireless Web**.
- 3. Press 64NO Web Guard.
- **4.** The following options are displayed:
- None to disable the Web Guard
- **To Start** to require an extra step when launching the Browser.
- **To End** to require an extra step when exiting the Browser.
- **Both** to require an extra step when launching and when exiting the Browser.
- **5.** Select the desired choice and press $\{$

Using the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser

Using the Browser is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for navigating the Sprint PCS Wireless Web:

Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some wireless Internet sites.

Scroll up or down to view line by line. You can also use the volume keys on the side of your phone to quickly scroll one page at a time rather than one line at a time.

Tip: The tenth item in a numbered list may be selected by pressing the tenth item of key on your phone's keypad, even though the number 0 doesn't appear on the screen.

Going to a Wireless Internet Site

From the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page, you can go to a wireless Internet site simply by highlighting the desired site name and activating the OK softkey. Note that the list of wireless Internet sites extends beyond one page.

- Select More... to see additional site listings.
- ► To access a site that does not appear on the Home Page, use the **Go To...** function (on page 2 of the Home Page). You'll be required to enter the URL (site address) for the site you want to visit. It is not necessary to enter "http://" before the site name. Only HDML and WML sites are accessible.

Going Back

Entering Text

Some wireless Internet sites require that you enter text using your phone's keypad. See "Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input" on page 53 or "Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad" on page 52.

Creating a Bookmark

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of favorite wireless Internet pages for easy access at a later time.

To create a bookmark.

- 1. Navigate to the desired mobile web site using the Wireless Web browser.
- 2. Press and hold 🖉 to display the **Browser Menu**.
- 3. Press 4 for Mark Site.
- **4.** Press **8** to save the bookmark to the Bookmark List.
- **5.** Press a to exit the browser menu and return to the web page.

Note: Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address.

Note: Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Bookmark availability is determined by web site developers.

Accessing a Bookmark

To access a bookmark from the Sprint PCS Home Page:

- Press and hold 🖉 to display the **Browser Menu**. 1.
- 2. Press **3**DEF for **Bookmarks**.
- Select the desired bookmark from the list and press & . 3.
- 4. The bookmarked web page is displayed.

Deleting a Bookmark

- 1. Press and hold 🖉 to display the **Browser Menu**.
- Press **3**DEF for **Bookmarks**. 2.
- 3. Using the navigation button, select the bookmark that you want to delete.
- 4. Press 🚳
- 5. Press for Erase.
 6. Press to confirm deletion or *b* to cancel.

The Browser Menu

The Browser Menu contains several special functions. To access the Browser Menu, press and hold \Im .

- **Reload** to refresh the display.
- ▶ Home to access the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page.
- **Bookmarks** to mark the site.
- Mark Site to create a bookmark for the current wireless Internet site.
- About Openwave to display information about the Openwave browser.
- Advanced to display advanced options for your Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser. (You should only use when instructed by Sprint PCS Customer Care.)

Ending a Browser Session

To end a browser session and disconnect from the Sprint PCS Wireless Web, press

Troubleshooting

If you're having trouble using the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser, use the following troubleshooting guide:

Problem: You can't escape from a particular site.

Recommendation: Go to the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page by pressing and holding **GB**.

Problem: You continue to receive errors when using a certain site.

Recommendation: Try again later. Sites are sometimes temporarily inaccessible due to high traffic. If the problem persists, there may be a problem with the site.

Problem: The Browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding.

Recommendation: Reset the Browser by going to the Browser Menu and selecting the "Restart" option. If that doesn't work, turn your phone off then on again. If that also fails, try removing the battery and then replacing it.

If none of these solutions work, please contact Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Problem: An error message says the phone is not yet registered for Sprint PCS Wireless Web services.

Recommendation: Sprint PCS Wireless Web services can take longer to activate than voice services. Please try again later. If the problem persists for more than one day, please contact Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Problem: The message "Service Not Available" appears.

Recommendation: Your phone can't acquire a signal or you are in an area that does not yet support Sprint PCS Wireless Web services. If possible, try to find an area that supports Sprint PCS Wireless Web services. If you continue to receive this message, please contact Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Problem: The message "Data Server Unavailable" appears.

Recommendation: Sprint PCS Wireless Web services are temporarily unavailable for some reason. Please try again later. If this problem persists, please contact Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Problem: The message "IP Address Missing" appears.

Recommendation: Your phone's factory settings have been altered. Please contact Sprint PCS Customer Care for assistance.

My Sprint PCS Wireless Web

My Sprint PCS Wireless Web lets you manage your Wireless Web bookmarks and create a personalized menu of wireless Internet sites to give you control over your Internet experience. Simply log on to www.sprintpcs.com from your PC, click on the Manage section and locate your account profile. From there, you can build and modify your menu by selecting and arranging your favorite web sites into as many as 27 customized folders. When you launch the Sprint PCS Wireless Web on your Sprint PCS Phone, you will instantly see your personalized menu.

To customize and access My Sprint PCS Wireless Web:

- 1. Press 🔏 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **2ABC** for **Wireless Web**.
- 3. Press **4** for **Start Browser**.
- 4. If the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Home Page is not displayed, press 🚷 .
- 5. Select @SprintPCS (or AOL), and press 🚷
- **6.** Select **Sprint PCS Mail**, and press **&**. (If you are a first-time user, follow the prompts to set up your Sprint PCS Wireless Web account. A user name and password must also be established.)
- 7. To view your messages scroll to highlight **Inbox**, and press **(**, (or scroll to highlight **Mail** from the America Online home page and press **(**).

To sign up for AOL Instant Messenger service, visit the AOL Instant Messenger page from your personal computer at www.sprintpcs.com. Or visit www.aol.com and register for an AOL Instant Messenger screen name and password by downloading the software as instructed. You do not have to be an AOL member to utilize this service.

To access AOL Instant Messenger from your Sprint PCS Phone:

- 1. Press 🖉 for Main Menu.
- 2. Press **2**ABC for **Wireless Web**.
- 3. Press **4** for **Start Browser**.
- 4. If the Wireless Web home page is not displayed, press 🚷 .
- 5. Select Messaging or AOL, and press 🚯 .
- 6. Select AOL IM, and press 🚷
- 7. When the AOL Instant Messenger screen is displayed, press 🚷 .
- **8.** Enter your AOL Instant Messenger screen name and press **§**. (Use the screen name you created when you signed up for the AOL Instant Messenger Service.)

Note: Remember, all the letters in your password must be lowercase.

9. Enter your password and press 🚳 . The AOL Instant Messenger menu is displayed.

To send AOL Instant Messages:

- **1.** Access the AOL Instant Messenger screen as outlined above and enter your screen name and password.

- 5. Select **Messaging** and press

- 1. When you receive a Short Mail message, you will see or "1 New Short Mail Message" on your display screen.
- 2. If "1 New Short Mail Message" displays, press 🚯 to go to the message location.

Note: If your phone does not receive Web Alerts, you cannot receive Short Mail Messages.

To reply to a Short Mail message:

- 1. While the message is open, scroll to **Reply** and press 🚷 .
- 3. Enter your text or select a preset message or icon and press 🚷

To add and/or edit pretyped messages:

To select the Internet-based information you want sent to your Sprint PCS Phone:

- Go to the site from which you want to receive information. A few of the sites you can visit are America Online[®], amazon.com[®], eCompare![®], ebay[®], FoxSports.com[®] and FTD.com[®]. (The location where you request updates within each site will vary.)
- **3.** Where indicated on the site, input your Sprint PCS 10-digit phone number followed by "@messaging.sprintpcs.com." For example: 5551234567@messaging.sprintpcs.com.

Upon completing the registration process, you should begin receiving your updates on your Sprint PCS Phone as requested.

Your wireless Internet-ready Sprint PCS Phone allows you to connect to a laptop PC, hand-held or palm-sized computing device to send and receive e-mail, access the Internet or your company's network and more, without searching for a wall-mounted telephone jack. In just three steps, you can use your connectivity:

- **1.** First, you'll need a Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection Kit (sold separately).
- **2.** Connect your laptop PC to your Sprint PCS Phone by using the serial data cable. The cable adapter will connect to a handheld or palm-sized computing device.
- **3.** Finally, take a few minutes to install the Sprint PCS DialerSM software onto your computer using your CD.
- ► For complete details on how to install and use the software, refer to the user guide in the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection Kit you purchased.

Placing a Data Call

To place a data call while you're connected to the Sprint PCS Wireless Web:

- 1. First, make sure the cable is connected properly.
- **2.** Open the Sprint PCS Dialer application on your computer and place the call.
- The phone displays the number your computer is calling and a "connecting" message is displayed.
- Once the call successfully connects, your phone's display shows you information on the status of the data call.

Receiving Sprint PCS Wireless Web Calls

Most users use the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection to place outgoing data/fax calls. But you can also set up your Sprint PCS Phone to receive (host) data and fax calls. Because each phone model is different, the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection Kit doesn't include instructions for how to set up your phone to receive data and fax calls. Here's the procedure to set up your Sprint PCS Phone to receive a (mobile-terminated) data or fax call:

- 1. Select the menu option to enable incoming data/fax calls. Note that incoming voice calls are not possible when your Sprint PCS Phone is set to receive data/fax calls.
- **2.** Once you've received the incoming data/fax call, you may want to return the phone to its normal state by disabling incoming data/fax calls.

Using Special Features During a Sprint PCS Wireless Web Call

Your phone gives you the ability to use special features while you're on a Sprint PCS Wireless Web call. They are outlined below:

Caller ID: Just like your phone stores regular Caller ID numbers, it also stores the numbers of incoming Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection calls. To distinguish between the two types of calls, "Data" or "Fax" displays along with the number of the caller when you view your Caller ID records.

Note: Caller ID is not available on Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser calls.

- ► Call Waiting: If someone tries to reach you while you're connected to the Sprint PCS Wireless Web, your phone behaves like it is turned OFF. Depending on your service, callers may get your voicemail. Call Waiting is automatically deactivated whenever you place or receive a Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection call.
- ► Accessing features: You can still access most of your phone's features while you're connected on a Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection Call. You can navigate the phone's menu system to change or view your phone's features or phone book entries. You can also read messages or view the Caller ID records that you received before placing the call.

Ending a Sprint PCS Wireless Web Call

It's important to note that some of the normal ways to end a call won't work with the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Connection calls. You should always close the connection through the application on your computer. Your phone will then return to Standby mode.

P art of getting the most out of your Sprint PCS $^{\circledast}$ Phone is knowing where and how it works at optimum efficiency. This section outlines performance and safety guidelines that ensure you experience the full quality your Sprint PCS Phone was designed to give you.

Navigating and **20** Entering Text

Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is on, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to Standby mode.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your Sprint PCS Phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below.

In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- ▶ Hold the phone with the antenna up, fully-extended and over your shoulder.
- ▶ Try not to ever hold, bend or twist the phone antenna.
- Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.

Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a Sprint PCS Center or call Sprint PCS Customer Care for service.

Note: For the best care of your phone, only Sprint PCS authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS OUTLINED MAY LEAD TO SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY AND POSSIBLE PROPERTY DAMAGE

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on the phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- ▶ Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and redial.
- ▶ When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- ▶ Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial guess 1 I are to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

Tip: Purchase an optional Hands-Free Car Kit.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating and entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations
- Below deck on boats
- ▶ Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to Your Phone

Your Sprint PCS Phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your phone bill.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Sprint PCS-approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- ▶ In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- ▶ Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- ▶ Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. It can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month: 4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)

More than one month: 4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

Disposal of Lithium Ion (Lilon) Batteries

For safe disposal options of your LiIon batteries, contact your nearest Sprint PCSauthorized service center.

Special note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Note: For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Lilon battery.

Acknowledging Special Precautions and the FCC Notice

FCC Notice

The phone may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the phone if such interference cannot be eliminated.

Vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) must comply with the National Fire Protection Standard (NFPA-58). For a copy of this standard, contact the National Fire Protection Association, One Batterymarch Park, Quincy, MA 02269, Attn: Publication Sales Division.

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and voids the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.

Body-Worn Operation

To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines, if you wear a handset on your body, use the Sprint PCS supplied or approved carrying case, holster or other body-worn accessory. If you do not use a body-worn accessory, ensure the antenna is at least one inch (2.5 centimeters) from your body when transmitting. Use of non-Sprint PCS approved accessories may violate FCC RF exposure guidelines.

For more information about RF exposure, please visit the FCC website at www.fcc.gov.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) for Wireless Phones

The SAR is a value that corresponds to the relative amount of RF energy absorbed in the head of a user of a wireless handset.

The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be substantially less that the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.

All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. SAR values at or below the federal standard of 1.6 W/kg are considered safe for use by the public.

Termination and Changing Service Plans). For purposes of the Agreement, "use" includes keeping the right to access the Sprint PCS Network by not terminating Services. You may not modify the Agreement except for your Service Plan (see Termination and Changing Service Plans).

Service Plan

You may be eligible for a fixed length Service Plan ("Term Service Plan") or for a month-to-month Service Plan ("Non-Term Service Plan"). We determine the Service Plan for which you qualify. We may offer non-identical Service Plans to different individuals or entities. Services and coverage under some Service Plans may be more limited than available under other Service Plans. Your Service Plan sets out the charges for Services and is your Service Plan until that Service Plan is changed, you switch to a different Service Plan, or your Services terminate. Your Service Plan may require that you make a deposit, prepayment, or a series of deposits or prepayments, or be subject to an account spending limit, before Services are activated or maintained.

Changing Service Plans

If you are on a Non-Term Service Plan, you may change to a different Service Plan for which you qualify. Any change is effective at the start of your next full invoicing cycle unless otherwise specified by us at the time that you place your change order. If you change or add a different Service Plan or service feature and the change is effective prior to the start of your next full invoicing cycle, you will be invoiced a prorated amount. We may require a service charge for implementing any change directed by you as well as the Service Plan or optional service features you select. If you are on a Term Service Plan, your ability to change to another Service Plan may be limited and we may require you to pay a termination fee as set out in your Service Plan.

Use of Services and Equipment; Availability

You must be at least 18 years old to subscribe to our Services. We may require you to provide proof of your age and identity. If you are under 18 years old you may be eligible for certain Services that have Account Spending Limits if a person 18 years or older is also named as a subscriber on the Account. Services and equipment may not be used for any unlawful, fraudulent or abusive purpose. By requesting Services, you agree that you will not use Services and equipment in any unlawful, fraudulent or abusive manner. You may not resell or lease Services or equipment to anyone. Services are available within the operating range of the Sprint PCS Network. Coverage and quality of Services may be affected by conditions within or beyond our control, including atmospheric, geographic, or topographic conditions. We do not guarantee that there will be no interruptions or delays in Services. Your Sprint PCS PhoneTM will not accept the services of any wireless provider other than Sprint PCS (but see Roaming).

Number

We assign a phone number ("Number") to the phone or other equipment used by you on the Sprint PCS Network. We may change the Number without compensation by giving you prior notice. You do not own the Number. You may not modify the Number we program into any phone or other equipment.

Phone Activation Fee

You may be required to pay a non-refundable phone activation fee when you activate a new Number, have us switch a Number to a different phone, we activate a different phone on your existing account or your Service Plan says so. Details on any applicable phone activation fee are set out in your Service Plan or can be obtained by calling Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Charges

For most forms of wireless Service, your usage will be charged from the time you first initiate contact between your phone or other wireless device and the network until the network connection is broken, whether or not you are successful in connecting with the service with which you seek to connect, even if the connection is later broken or dropped. An exception is that you are not charged for voice calls that are not completed. You are charged for completed calls to your Number from the time shortly before the phone starts ringing until the call is terminated by either party. You will be charged peak rates for the entire duration of calls initiated during the peak time periods applicable to your Service. You will be charged off-peak rates for the entire duration of calls initiated during the off-peak time periods applicable to your Service. In addition to these usage charges, you may be charged for recurring monthly service charges, applicable local and long-distance toll charges, other usage charges, connection fees, roaming charges, directory assistance, call completion charges, optional features you select at an extra cost, and taxes and other regulatory related charges. Charges for most Services are incurred in one-minute increments, with partial minutes of use rounded up to the next highest minute. You must pay, by each invoice due date, all charges for Services provided to the Number for each phone or other equipment that our records show you activated, no matter who actually uses or has possession of the phone or other equipment at the time Services are provided.

Voice Command

Sprint PCS Voice CommandSM is an optional service that allows you to place calls by using speech recognition technology. Calls to 911 or similar emergency numbers cannot be placed through the Voice Command feature. Airtime and applicable long distance charges for a call completed from your Number using the Voice Command feature begin when you press or activate the TALK or similar keys and end when your call is terminated by hitting the END key or by returning to the Voice Command platform. If you initiate and complete another call without leaving the Voice Command platform, a separate charge for that call will begin from the time the previous call was terminated. Airtime and applicable long distance charges will be applied to the entire length of a completed call initiated from Voice Command. Using Directory Assistance to input names into your Voice Command address book will incur additional charges. Details on charges for the Voice Command feature can be found in the marketing materials for this feature, by visiting www.sprintpcs.com or by calling Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Invoicing

Invoicing cycles are approximately 30 days in length. Invoicing cycles and dates may change from time to time. Except as otherwise provided in your Service Plan, monthly recurring charges (MRCs) are invoiced one invoicing cycle in advance. Charges for Services are usually invoiced as soon as possible after the charges accrue. We may, however, invoice you for usage and charges occurring before the invoicing

cycle being invoiced, if they were not previously invoiced. If you are invoiced for usage incurred during a prior invoicing cycle, those minutes will be applied to your Service Plan minutes for the current invoicing cycle. However, if you change your Service Plan between the time the usage was incurred and the beginning of the current invoicing cycle, those minutes from the prior invoicing cycle will be charged at the rate per minute for usage over included minutes provided in the Service Plan in effect at the time the usage was incurred.

Payment

If you have authorized payment for Services or equipment by credit card or by debiting a bank account, no additional notice or consent is required before we invoice the credit card or debit the bank account for all amounts due to us or billed by us on behalf of a third party. You must promptly notify us of any change in your invoicing address or of the credit card or bank account used for payment. We reserve the right to require payment by money order, cashier's check or other secured form of payment. If we take action to receive payment beyond invoicing you for charges for Services or equipment, you must pay our costs and expenses of collection, including attorneys' fees and expenses, the fees of any collection agency and court costs. If we act as an invoicing agent for a third-party service provider, payments received are first applied to amounts due and owing to us and any remaining amounts are applied to sums due and owing to the third-party service provider. We may charge an additional fee for any check or other negotiable instrument endorsed by you and returned unpaid by a financial institution for any reason. You may be charged fees for certain methods of payment.

Late Payment Charges

Payment is past due if we do not receive it by the due date shown on your invoice. Any payment for Services and equipment not made when due accrues late charges until paid at the rate of 1.5% per month or at the highest rate allowed by law. Late charges are prorated daily for each day that payment is past due, but are not compounded monthly. Acceptance of late or partial payments (even if marked "paid in full") does not waive our right to collect all amounts that you owe us.

Disputed Charges

You must raise any dispute that you have about any charges invoiced to you within 15 days of the date of the invoice or you have accepted the invoice. You may notify us of any dispute by notifying Sprint PCS Customer Care. Calls to our sales or general business offices are not notice of a dispute. If disputed invoice procedures are described on the invoice, you must follow them.

Termination. Non-Term Service Plan.

If you are on a Non-Term Service Plan you may terminate Services at any time by giving us notice. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, we may terminate Services at any time, with or without notice. We may deactivate any Number before you receive notice of termination without liability to you. Termination by either of us may be with or without cause.

Termination. Term Service Plan.

If you are on a Term Service Plan (1) your ability to terminate Services before the end of the term is limited, (2) your ability to change to another Service Plan before the

end of the term may be limited, and may result in a termination or activation fee, (3) you may be required to pay a termination fee, (4) we may not terminate Services without cause before the end of the term and (5) if we terminate Services for cause before the end of the term, you may be required to pay a termination fee. No termination fee is charged if you terminate a Term Service Plan within 14 days of activation of your Sprint PCS Phone. During the term we must give each other notice to terminate Services. At and after the expiration of the term, you may terminate Services at any time by giving us notice and we may, subject to this Agreement, terminate Services at any time, with or without notice.

Termination. General.

Regardless of whether you have a Non-Term or a Term Service Plan, we may terminate or suspend Services to you without liability (1) if you breach any provision of this Agreement (including if you fail to pay any charges for Services), or (2) if you fail to pay any charges due us for equipment or otherwise. If you promptly cure the breach, we may, but are not obligated to, reactivate Services to you. You must pay all charges for (a) Services provided before termination of a Number and (b) equipment, regardless of who terminates Services. If Services are terminated before the end of your current invoicing cycle, (i) the monthly recurring charge is not prorated to the date of termination, and (ii) you will not receive a credit or refund for any unused minutes in your Service Plan.

Account Spending Limit

If we agree to provide Services to you on an Account Spending Limit basis, we will tell you your Account Spending Limit before we start Services to your Number, or as reasonably practicable after the limit is imposed. If we require a deposit for you to establish or keep Services on an Account Spending Limit basis, we will hold the deposit as partial guarantee of payment for Services (see Deposits). Charges for Services accrue against your Account Spending Limit as they are incurred. We may charge an initial ASL start up fee. We may charge a monthly ASL service fee, in addition to your recurring monthly service charge. We may suspend Services to your Number without prior notice to you when your account balance reaches your Account Spending Limit. Services are restored when you have paid any past due balance and pay a specified minimum amount to reduce your account balance below your Account Spending Limit. We may change this minimum amount at any time upon notice to you. You may pay any past due balance and the minimum amount by any method authorized by Sprint PCS. Call Sprint PCS Customer Care for information about authorized methods of making these payments. We may charge you a fee for calls that involve our live customer care services. If we provide Services to you on an Account Spending Limit basis, Services and coverage may be limited in certain ways. You must pay all charges for Services even if they exceed the amount of your Account Spending Limit.

Deposits

If we require a deposit for you to establish or keep Services, we will hold the deposit as partial guarantee of payment for Services. We may change the deposit amount at any time to reflect revised estimated monthly charges based upon your usage. A deposit may not be used to pay any invoice (unless it is used to pay a final invoice) or delay payment. The deposit amount, the length of time we hold the deposit and changes to the deposit amount are determined based on your credit and payment history. The rate of interest on the deposit is subject to change. We may mix deposits with our

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other funds. If Services are terminated for any reason, we may, without notice to you, apply your deposit toward payment of outstanding charges and return any excess to you at your last known address within 75 days after termination of Services. If the U.S. Postal Service cannot deliver the money to you and returns it to us, we will hold it for you for one year from the date of return and, during that period, we may charge a monthly servicing fee against the deposit balance. Any money held during this one-year period will not accrue interest for your benefit. You forfeit any portion of the money left after the one-year period.

Wireless Web and Voice Portal Services

Wireless Web Services are part of the Services that can be obtained through Sprint PCS. Wireless Web Services may not be immediately available in some Sprint PCS affiliate markets. Use of Wireless Web Services requires a wireless data compatible phone or certain other equipment (or both) and is subject to any memory, storage or other limitation in the phone or other equipment. The Caller ID blocking feature is not available when using Wireless Web Services. For data calls (including Wireless Web and Voice Portal calls) that are attempted, but not completed, you are charged for the time during which the network attempts to connect the call. You are charged for time spent connected to the Wireless Web or Voice Portal, including time spent browsing on the Internet or Voice Portal and reviewing or scrolling through Internet information on-line while still connected to the Sprint PCS Network. Not all Internet sites can be accessed and you may receive an error message if you attempt to access a site that cannot be accessed through Wireless Web Services. You are also charged for Wireless Web connections to review your Sprint PCS account information. Wireless Web Services and Voice Portal data calls may not be available when you are roaming off the Sprint PCS Network. Wireless Web Services are not available to you if you are on a Sprint PCS Prepaid Service Plan. If you receive Services on an Account Spending Limit basis, you may be limited in the Wireless Web and Voice Portal Services available to you. Call Sprint PCS Customer Care or visit our website at www.sprintpcs.com for availability and equipment compatibility information. Specific additional information about Wireless Web Services and Voice Portal Services, including pricing, included minutes and combining with other Service Plans, is available in our standard sales collateral for Sprint PCS Wireless Web Services and Voice Portal Services or at www.sprintpcs.com. Sprint PCS is not a publisher of third party content that can be accessed through Wireless Web Services or Voice Portal Services. Sprint PCS is not responsible for any opinions, advice, statements, services or other information is provided by third parties and accessible through Wireless Web Services or Voice Portal Services. Neither Sprint PCS nor its vendors or licensors guarantees the accuracy, completeness or usefulness of information that is obtained through the Wireless Web Services or Voice Portal Services. You are responsible for evaluating such content.

Taxes and Other Regulatory Related Charges

We invoice you for taxes, fees and other charges levied by federal, state or local authorities, or foreign government on Services. We also assess charges associated with regulatory mandates and obligations, such as Universal Service and Enhanced 911 service. If you claim any tax exemption, you must provide us with a valid tax-exempt document. Any tax exemption applies only from the date we receive a valid tax-exempt document.

Roaming

Calls made outside of your Home Service Area and outside of the Sprint PCS Network are "roaming" calls. Your Sprint PCS phone is specifically designed and engineered to work only on the Sprint PCS Network. It works on another CDMA PCS provider's system only when a roaming agreement is in place between Sprint PCS and the other provider. If your Sprint PCS Phone is a dual-mode phone, it works on both a CDMA PCS provider's system (in addition to the Sprint PCS Network) and a wireless analog telecommunications provider's system only when roaming agreements are in place between Sprint PCS and the other providers. If we do not have a roaming agreement in place, you may be able to place roaming calls "manually" by using a valid credit card. If there is a gap or other interruption of coverage within a Sprint PCS coverage area that prevents connection with the Sprint PCS network and your dual-mode phone is set to roam automatically when outside Sprint PCS coverage, you may incur roaming fees within a Sprint PCS coverage area. Certain features are not available when roaming. Roaming rates may be different from and higher than the rates you pay for calls within your Sprint PCS Home Service Area and on the Sprint PCS Network. Roaming charges are invoiced according to the practices of the roaming service provider. When roaming, you are subject to the limitation of liability provisions and other applicable rules imposed by the roaming service provider.

Interruption of Service

We may give credit for a continuous interruption of Services for more than 24 hours on a case-by-case basis. Interruptions caused by your negligent or willful actions, or by failure of equipment or service not provided by us, or by causes beyond our reasonable control, do not qualify for credit. We may provide you with an airtime credit of one minute for a call that is disconnected because of transmission limitations caused by atmospheric, geographic or topographic conditions and that you redial within one minute of disconnection. You must notify us within 24 hours of the disconnection to request credit.

Phones and Other Equipment

Phones and other equipment may be purchased and returned as provided in the purchase documents. We are not the manufacturer of the phones or other equipment. The only warranties on the phones or other equipment are any limited warranties extended by the manufacturers. We have no liability in connection with the phones and other equipment or for the manufacturers' acts or omissions.

Lost or Stolen Equipment

If your phone or other equipment is lost or stolen, you must notify us by calling Sprint PCS Customer Care. You are responsible for all charges for Services provided to the Number for the lost or stolen equipment before you notify us of the loss or theft. We will deactivate Services to the Number upon notification to us of any loss or theft. You may be required to provide evidence of the loss or theft (for example, a police report or swom statement). If the equipment is later found, we may require that you exchange it for another phone or other equipment before we reactivate Services (if we do reactivate Services), as well as require you to pay a reactivation fee. We will deactivate Services to any Number without prior notice to you if we suspect any unlawful or fraudulent use of the Number. You agree to cooperate reasonably with us in investigating suspected unlawful or fraudulent use.

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Caller ID

If you do not want people you call to get the Number assigned to your phone, you must call Sprint PCS Customer Care for information about automatic Caller ID blocking. The Number assigned to your phone can be blocked on a per-call basis by dialing *67 + Destination Number + OK, but Caller ID delivery resumes on the next call you make. Caller ID display on incoming calls to your Number depends on receiving the information from the calling party.

TTY Access

A TTY (also known as TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone. It is not possible to use your phone with a TTY.

Pay-Per-Call Service

We will not complete calls from your Number to 900, 976 and similar numbers for pay-per-call services.

International Calling

You may be limited in the international destinations that you can call with Services. You should contact Sprint PCS Customer Care for information about international destinations that you cannot call.

Limitation of Liability

Except as otherwise provided in this section, our sole liability to you for any loss or damage arising out of providing or failing to provide Services (including mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays, errors, or defects) does not exceed (1) in cases related to a specific piece of equipment, the prorated MRC for Services to the piece of equipment during the affected period, or (2) in cases not related to a specific piece of equipment, the prorated MRC for Services to the piece of equipment, the prorated MRCs for Services to you during the affected period. Neither we nor our vendors, suppliers or licensors are liable for any damage arising out of or in connection with:

a) any act or omission of any telecommunications service or other service provider other than us;

b) any directory listing;

c) any dropped calls or inability to place or receive calls;

d) any interruption of Services, including interruptions caused by equipment or facilities failure or shortages, transmission limitations or system capacity limitations;

e) traffic or other accidents, or any health-related claims allegedly arising from the use of Services, phones, equipment or accessories used in connection with the Services;

f) the use of Sprint PCS Wireless Web Services, including the accuracy or reliability of any information obtained from the Internet using Sprint PCS Wireless Web Services or from Voice Portal Services, or Internet services, content or applications not supported by Sprint PCS;

g) any late or failed message delivery;

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h) any interruption or failure of 911 or E911 emergency services or identification of the Number, address or name associated with any person accessing or attempting to access emergency services from your phone;

 i) the installation or repair of any products or equipment by parties who are not our authorized employees or agents;

 j) events due to factors beyond our control, including acts of God (including, without limitation, weather-related phenomena, fire or earthquake), war, riot, strike, or orders of governmental authority;

k) any act or omission of any third party or independent contractor that offers products or services in conjunction with or through the Services, or

l) your negligent or intentional act or omission.

NO CONSEQUENTIAL OR OTHER DAMAGES

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE WE LIABLE FOR ANY INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, PUNITIVE OR SPECIAL DAMAGES OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH PROVIDING OR FAILING TO PROVIDE SERVICES, PHONES OR OTHER EQUIPMENT USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE SERVICES, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, LOST PROFITS, LOSS OF BUSINESS, OR COST OF REPLACEMENT PRODUCTS AND SERVICES. THIS SECTION SURVIVES TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

Indemnification

You indemnify and defend us, our partners, directors, officers, employees and agents from and against any claim, action, damage, liability and expense arising out of or in connection with: (1) your acts or omissions that occur in connection with your use of the Services or equipment used in connection with the Services, and (2) any communications you make or receive using the Services. This indemnification extends to and includes any attorney's fees and costs incurred by us arising from any actions or claims to which this indemnification applies, or from the contesting of the applicability of this provision. This section survives termination of this Agreement.

ARBITRATION OF DISPUTES

ANY CLAIM, CONTROVERSY OR DISPUTE, WHETHER SOUNDING IN CONTRACT, STATUTE, OR TORT, INCLUDING FRAUD, MISREPRESENTATION, OR ANY OTHER LEGAL THEORY, RELATED DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY TO THE SERVICES, WHETHER BETWEEN THE COMPANY AND THE CUSTOMER OR BETWEEN THE COMPANY OR THE CUSTOMER, ON THE ONE HAND, AND EMPLOYEES, AGENTS OR AFFILIATED BUSINESSES OF THE OTHER PARTY, ON THE OTHER HAND, SHALL BE RESOLVED BY ARBITRATION AS PRESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION. THE FEDERAL ARBITRATION ACT, NOT STATE LAW, GOVERNS THE QUESTION OF WHETHER A CLAIM IS SUBJECT TO ARBITRATION.

A single arbitrator engaged in the practice of law will conduct the arbitration under the rules of the American Arbitration Association. The arbitrator will be selected in accordance with AAA procedures from a list of qualified people maintained by the AAA. All expedited procedures prescribed by the AAA rules will apply, and each party will bear their own costs and attorney's fees.

No discovery will be permitted, except that the parties will exchange, thirty days prior to the hearing on their dispute, all documents to be submitted to the arbitrator, including any reports or summaries, and a list of the names and addresses of those

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persons to be called to testify. Following exchange of this information, the parties may agree to waive a hearing.

The arbitrator will have authority only to award compensatory damages and will not have authority to award punitive damages, lost profits, or other non-compensatory damages. The arbitrator's decision and award will be final and binding, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court with jurisdiction. The arbitrator's decision must not contain findings of fact or conclusions of law.

If any party files a judicial or administrative action asserting a claim that is subject to arbitration and another party successfully stays such action or compels arbitration, the party filing that action must pay the other party's costs and expenses incurred in seeking such stay or compelling arbitration, including attorney's fees.

Notices

You may get our current address for written notice by calling Sprint PCS Customer Care. Written notice to you is sent to your last known address in our invoicing records. Written notice is deemed delivered 3 days after deposit in the U.S. mail, postage prepaid, and properly addressed. Unless required by this Agreement or Applicable Laws, (1) you may notify us by calling Sprint PCS Customer Care, and (2) we may notify you by leaving a message for you on your Sprint PCS Phone, answering machine or with your answering service. Notice addresses may be changed by giving notice as provided in this section.

Choice of Law; Jurisdiction

This Agreement is governed by and must be construed under federal law and the laws of the State of Kansas, without regard to choice of law principles. You agree to submit yourself to the personal jurisdiction of the courts in the State of Kansas.

General

If either of us does not enforce any right or remedy available under this Agreement. that failure is not a waiver of the right or remedy for any other breach or failure by the other party. Our waiver of any requirement in any one instance is not a general waiver of that requirement and does not amend this Agreement. If any part of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, that part is interpreted consistent with Applicable Laws as nearly as possible to reflect the original intentions of the parties and the rest of this Agreement remains in full force and effect. Section headings are for descriptive purposes only and are not used to interpret this Agreement. You may not assign this Agreement to any other person or entity without our prior written approval. This Agreement (including any referenced documents and attachments) makes up the entire agreement between you and us and replaces all prior written or spoken agreements, representations, promises or understandings between you and us. The provisions of this Agreement that are contemplated to be enforceable after the termination of the Agreement survive termination of this Agreement. This Agreement is subject to any applicable federal and state law (collectively, "Applicable Laws"). If there is a conflict, the Service Plan (including any Term Service Plan) controls over the Terms.

The following provisions are not generally applicable and apply only to customers whose Service Plans include these terms:

Traveling

If you are making or receiving calls outside you Home Service Area but on the Sprint PCS Network, you may be charged for Services at a "travel" rate for both outgoing and incoming traveling calls. Long distance charges may not be included in the travel rate. Traveling charges do not apply if you subscribe to a Home Rate USA plan or to both Toll-Free USA and Home Rate USA. (See Home Rate USA and Toll-Free USA for more information.) You do not have to register your Number when traveling outside your Home Service Area.

Home Rate USA

This service lets you make or receive calls from anywhere on the Sprint PCS Network at your Home Service Area airtime rates.

Toll-Free USA

This service lets you call from anywhere on the Sprint PCS Network to anywhere in the United States, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands and be charged at your Home Service Area airtime rates, with no additional long distance charges. If you have Home Rate USA but do not have Toll-Free USA, and if you make a long distance call outside of your defined local calling area, you are invoiced for the long distance charges.
